Less than a month into his term, Commissioner Wheeler led a proactive response to the unprecedented Gulf Coast blizzard. Crews pre-treated roads and worked 24/7 to keep residents safe. The team's round-the-clock updates ensured the community stayed informed about closures and icy conditions.

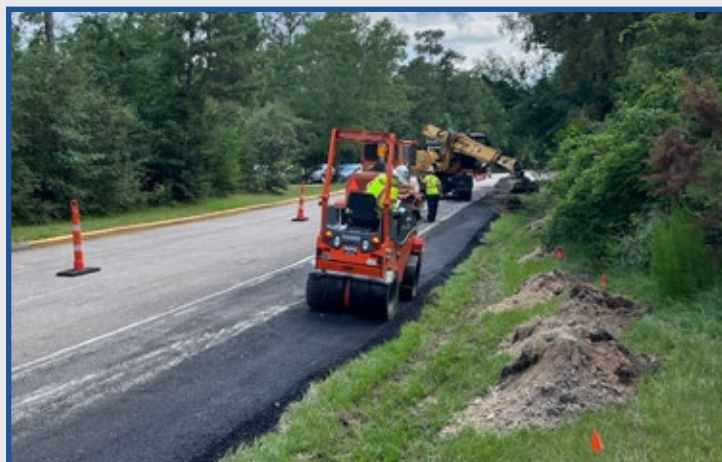
### COMMISSIONER WHEELER LED RECYCLING WEEK EFFORTS, KEEPING 5,600 POUNDS OF HAZARDOUS WASTE OUT OF OUR ENVIRONMENT.

This spring's Free Recycling Week set records:

- 1,750 vehicles served
- 5,600 lbs. of hazardous waste diverted
- 23,300 lbs. of electronics collected
- 8,000+ gallons of paint
- 300 tires kept out of landfills

### \$120 MILLION SECURED FOR LOCAL ROAD PROJECTS, WITH NO TAX INCREASE.



Thanks to strong planning and leadership by Commissioner Wheeler and his Executive Leadership Team, Precinct 3 will receive \$120 million from the 2025 Road Bond to improve mobility, safety, and infrastructure across our communities without raising the property tax rate.

#### Key Projects:

- Road widening on Robinson Road
- New bridge over Panther Branch Creek (Sawdust Road)
- Intersection improvements & turn lanes
- Asphalt shoulder replacements to improve drainage & safety

#### Project Scheduling for You:

Projects are strategically sequenced by roadway to minimize disruption and keep traffic moving during construction. Timelines and updates are available at [www.mctxpct3.org](http://www.mctxpct3.org), with some improvements set to begin as early as September.

As part of this responsive approach, Commissioner Wheeler also acted on public feedback gathered at a Town Hall and removed the proposed Townsen Boulevard extension from the bond list to reflect the community's concerns. 🗣️
